Q: Why did you choose to study at UK and how did you choose your major?

I chose UK because the campus location, environment, and opportunities were everything I was looking for in a college. At UK, I was able to keep playing oboe while choosing a major that focused on my career goals. I chose Human Health Sciences as my major because the required courses were centered on healthcare and were more specific than a general biology major.

Q: How do you balance playing the oboe with your studies? How does being a music minor fit into your life goals?

Balancing oboe with my studies was something I had to get used to. I learned to incorporate my practice time and reed making into my homework schedule

outside of ensembles and my other classes. After my freshman year, I began to schedule my practice time when I knew I would be at Fine Arts so after I finished. Whether I teach lessons, sell reeds, or play at church, I want to keep playing oboe. Q: What would you tell a prospective student considering UK?

If you haven't been to campus, make sure you schedule a visit! It's important to be able to see yourself going to classes and studying at the libraries that UK has to offer before you become a student. UK also has multiple opportunities that allow students to continue playing without being a music major, so keep that in mind!

Q: You're graduating in May. What's next?

After graduation, I hope to be on the track to graduate school. Medical school and Physician Assistant Programs have my interest right now, so we'll see where I'll end up!

Q: What would you consider your biggest
